#### Data Protection & UKGDPR

The laws around data protection changed on 25 May 2018 and the new legislation included the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). When the UK left the EU, new rules governing their relationship took effect. The UK has introduced its own version of the GDPR called the 'UK GDPR' because the scope of the original GDPR no longer covers the UK. The original GDPR is now called the EU GDPR. The UK GDPR is very similar to the EU GDPR-so in practice there is little change to the core data protection principles & rights.. The UK GDPR applies to personal data processed in the UK and individuals in the UK. The UK GDPR sits alongside the UK Data Protection Act 2018. The law gives clarity over the roles and responsibilities of anyone who gathers information on others, as well as setting out enhanced rights of the people whose data is collected.
